32 "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 33 Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come. 34 It's like a man going away: He leaves his house and puts his servants in charge, each with their assigned task, and tells the one at the door to keep watch.

35 "Therefore keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back—whether in the evening, or at midnight, or when the rooster crows, or at dawn. 36 If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping. 37 What I say to you, I say to everyone: 'Watch!'"

Sermon Text: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

"5 Concerning the times and dates, brothers, there is no need to write to you, 2 for you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. 3 When people are saying, "Peace and security," destruction will suddenly come on them, like labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will certainly not escape. 4 But you, brothers, are not in the dark so that this day takes you by surprise like a thief, 5 for you are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or the darkness. 6 So then let us not sleep like everyone else, but rather let us remain alert and sober.

7 To be sure, those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. 8 But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. 9 You see, God did not appoint us for wrath, but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. 10 He died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. 11 Therefore, encourage one another and build each other up, just as you are also doing."





The Season of Advent

Next Sunday is the first Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new Church Year. Advent is a season of preparation. Jesus' First Advent has made it possible for us to look ahead with anticipation to Christ's Second Advent. Just as a little child can't wait till Christmas, so we are waiting with anticipation for Jesus' second coming and we prepare our hearts to meet Him. Therefore we focus on our reconciliation with God through Jesus Christ which gives us Hope, Peace and Joy.

Advent also symbolizes our spiritual journey. Knowing that Jesus will come again in power gives us a reason for holy living. It gives us a profound sense that we live "between the times" and are called to be faithful stewards of what is entrusted to us as God's people.

Advent also speaks of our accountability before God and His judgment against sin. Therefore, the Season of Advent is a time of penitence for sins. It is only through the life, death and resurrection of the One born in Bethlehem, that we can look forward to His coming for judgment. By repentant faith we prepare for His Advent at the end of the world.

It is that call to repentance that gives reason for the purple color of Advent. This points to an important connection between Jesus' birth and death. The nativity, the Incarnation, cannot be separated from the crucifixion. Jesus came into the world to redeem lost sinners. So our humble repentance is an important part of our preparation. Purple is also the color of royalty, which is fitting as we prepare for our King.

There is also great joy as we await Jesus' Advent. This joy of the season is reflected in the rose candle on the third Sunday of Advent. Let us prepare our hearts for Jesus' return and celebrate with Joy His coming to save us.

Treasurer's Report: Our financial picture appears to have improved slightly since July, but that is only because the treasurer has had to draw from our US account to keep up with monthly expenses. We typically fall short of our expenses by \$200 - 300 per month. The balance in our General Fund was – \$127.80 at the end of September, but our US account has also been depleted almost \$1000 in the past three months. That may seem like a big problem, but it really only amounts to about \$10 per family per week. Consider if you are able to make a small increase to keeping this congregation afloat. We also pray for the Lord's blessings on our work.
